Grade Level:

____Singing Rounds: "Row Row Row Your Boat"_

Objectives: SWBAT sing independent parts in small groups within "Row, Row, Row Your Boat"

Process:

- T: "Hello, class! Today we will be we learn a new musical challenge with an old familiar song. If you recognize this melody raise your hand above your head"
- T: *Sings RRR*
- T: "Can you tell me the name of this song?"
- S: "RRR," some may not know it.
- T: This time, if you know the song please join me in singing. If this song is new for you pay careful attention
 to your nearest neightbor who knows they song" *Performs RRR with several students*
- T; "One way to help us learn new songs is pair our melody with movements that helps us remember the
 words. I like to imagine this song in two parts. The first part (row, row row) can be paired with a rowing
 movement. *Demonstrates singing and moving* Can anyone create a movement we can use to remember the
 second half?"
- S; *Provides movement*
- T: *Teacher leads a performance with all students including the movement x2"
- T: "Now that we all have the song ready it's time to show you the challenge. *Teacher demonstrates singing in a round with Ms. Heidi* Can Anybody tell me what just happened?
- S; *Answer*
- T: This is a called a round! It is a type of song with a melody that is performed in sequence. Your challenge is to be able to sing the melody with your group with out getting distracted by the other group! You can use your ears and your eyes to help you stay on track" *Splits students into 2 group. Leads performance of round*
- Extension: Sing the song in a 3-part round.
